The project is an ongoing 3 month collaboration amongst a group of primary and high schools including Hilltop Road PS, Elderslie PS, Granville East PS, Blairmount PS and Casula HS. The students will work together for a total of 6 visits, to devise an experiment that will be conducted at the International Space Station. The experiment has a technology based focus and students need to take into consideration, limited gravity and altitude. We are very excited to be part of the Cube Rider project as it is the first time that primary schools have ever been involved.
